What Makes Our Sisterhood Special Successful Recruitment, Philanthropy, Opportunities to Bond

Another wonderful semester has come to a close for Gamma Zeta Chapter, and we are excited to share all about it!

Our recruitment process continues to be what makes our chapter so special, and we are proud to report another successful year. Gamma Zeta welcomed 132 new members through a successful recruitment, and 11 members proudly served as Panhellenic recruitment counselors. Our Panhellenic involvement continues to grow as **Grace Fajardo '22** wraps up her term as vice president of membership and **Kate Hooper '23** begins her journey as vice president of community standards. Our involvement with Panhellenic is something we are always proud to share.

Our philanthropic efforts this year were a true highlight. This fall, we hosted Wellness Week, raising around \$17,000 for the JED Foundation. Wellness Week included a fundraiser at Jeremiah's Italian Ice, Greek Street Vintage, a blood drive, Krispy Kreme with KKG, and the Kappa Klassic pickleball tournament. These events were not just fundraisers; they were opportunities for our chapter to come together and support causes that deeply matter to us. We also broke new ground this year by approving bylaws that now require members to complete a minimum of eight community service hours.

Academically, we earned the highest overall GPA (3.6) among all fraternities and sororities for the fourth semester in a row in spring 2025. We also celebrated 142 members earning a perfect 4.0.

Beyond these amazing accomplishments, we hosted many engaging and fun events for our sisters to bond. These included our first date dash of the year with a masquerade theme, our first-ever new member bowling retreat, a family weekend market experience at the Kappa house featuring delicious food and tons of shopping, educational seminars ranging from women in business to alcohol safety, and so much more! Our programming-filled semester brought us closer together, and we are grateful to provide our sisters with opportunities to bond throughout their entire college experience.

A special thank-you to the 2025 chapter council as they wrap up their term. Their undeniable passion and genuine care for our chapter are what make Gamma Zeta so special. These accomplishments and events would not have been possible without the dedication of every Kappa sister. We continue to grow as a chapter, and we look forward to all that lies ahead.

It’s given me the opportunity to learn so much about the industry from many angles and get my feet wet in a variety of projects.”

Catching Up with Lauren Mueller O'Toole '10

When I arrived at the University, I had no plans to join a sorority. My mom, who was a proud Kappa, encouraged me to set aside any biases and go through recruitment. Like many young women, I was skeptical. I thought it was too girly and overwhelming, and I worried about how it might affect my reputation. But joining Kappa Kappa Gamma turned out to be one of the best decisions I made in college. When I joined Gamma Zeta, I was surrounded by smart, funny, driven, and supportive women who would become my lifelong friends.

A FAMILY LEGACY

My mom and three of my aunts were all Kappas at U of A, and having them at my initiation was incredibly special. Each of them passed down their Kappa keys, which I wore throughout college. Later, I surprised my cousin at her initiation at Cal Berkeley, passing one of those keys on to her. That generational connection made being a Kappa even more powerful.

LEADERSHIP AND GROWTH

Many of the older sisters were involved in campus organizations and prestigious honoraries. Their encouragement helped me set my sights high and earn my spot in LINK and Bobcats. In addition to honoring my grandfather by becoming Sigma Chi's Sweetheart, I also served as Gamma Zeta's education chair during my freshman year and was asked to be chapter president as a sophomore.

I was nervous, but thanks to support from upperclassmen, mentors, and advisors, it became one of the most rewarding parts of my college years!

LASTING MEMORIES

Some of my favorite memories are from everyday life in the chapter house. Saturday brunches were legendary — full of laughter and stories from the night before.

Living in the house, sharing clothes, and bonding over hair and makeup before formals made for unforgettable moments. I was the go-to

“hair girl,” and late-night glam and glitter-covered prep sessions brought us closer. Trips with sisters to Las Vegas for the PAC-

12 basketball tournaments were also core memories!

FINDING MY CALLING

A high school ACL injury first introduced me to physical therapy. I knew I wanted to help people get back to doing what they love, and I loved the idea of building relationships with patients and helping them regain strength and confidence. That passion led me to co-found Streamline Performance Physical Therapy in Phoenix with another U of A alum. Creating a space where people are treated with purpose and care has been the most fulfilling part of my career.

CAREER ADVICE

Building our practice from the ground up has taken hard work and patience, but it's worth it. We've worked with everyone from Olympians to everyday people overcoming pain. If you're considering physical therapy, shadow professionals in multiple areas to make sure you've truly found your passion and focus on networking.

SISTERHOOD THAT LASTS

Kappa taught me leadership, time management, how to talk to anyone, and the importance of being authentic. Gamma Zeta celebrated intelligence and encouraged me to be myself. I still stay in contact with my Kappa friends through group chats, visits, weddings, and baby showers. (Five of them were bridesmaids in my wedding, and countless others were there to celebrate!)

LIFE TODAY

I live in Phoenix with my husband, Cameron, and our dog, Margaux. When I'm not working at my practice, I'm supporting Cameron's work with the San Francisco 49ers by attending home games.
